Just a reminder about our WORKING BEE coming up on Sunday 18th from 10:00 -1:00.

We have several jobs that need doing so that our grounds can be maintained and continue to provide a wonderful ambience for our children and community.

We have a crew who are taking on one of our major projects which is to remove all the Prunus trees from along the main road front fence line which we will need to refill holes and down the track, plant an avenue of Carob trees.

As well, we have a multitude of smaller jobs that need doing. Several of these include tidying up the existing garden beds that are overgrown with weeds and tree/bush growth, so weeding and trimming lower branches is required. (Please bring secateurs, tree saws and wheelbarrows if you can).

Safety regulations in playgrounds required a minimum soft fall and we will have a fresh load to rake and replenish in two of our playground areas (so rakes and wheelbarrows required.)

We do have a range of garden tools and wheelbarrows, but if it's convenient for you to bring more from home, that will be really helpful. Also bring gloves and wear covered shoes.

At the end of our hard work, we will have a sausage sizzle. Children are definitely welcome.

BULLYING NO WAY!

Through the Lead Learn program that we undertook during term 1, a range of surveys were undertaken by staff and students to ascertain how well we were performing as a school, how well our staff were catering for student needs and how our students felt about our school culture and climate. These survey results have provided targeted feedback for our staff to analyse and to formulate achievable lines of action for school improvement. Investing in the voice of students and staff builds ownership of outcomes and results in a more inclusive school environment. (We are currently devising a survey seeking parent feedback on a range of issues).

In our compliance to report twice yearly to Governing Council on bullying data we will use the feedback from the student survey on school climate, i.e. what's happening in this school to create an inclusive environment?

This survey addressed a range of attitudes, structures and processes that included: teacher support, connectedness with peers and school, affirming diversity, rule clarity, reporting and seeking help, resilience, and wellbeing and bullying.

Focussing only on the bullying component here which assessed the degree to which students experienced bullying, the good news is that the majority of our students enjoy positive relationships with each other, feel safe and supported and have a range of strategies to draw upon when they do experience bullying.

In further developing an inclusive environment, we will continue to make bullying central to our wellbeing program and be proactive in developing systems and structures that support students to be self-managing. We hold a strong view that no-one deserves to be bullied and bullies must be stopped and that students must seek help or advice if subjected to bullying.

Teachers work through the following strategies with students:

IGNORE THE BULLY

- * A bully cannot look tough and popular if you don't react to them.
- * But if the bully persists, just walk away.

TALK TO THE BULLY DIRECTLY

- * This shows that you are not scared by the bully.
- * If that doesn't work, talk firmly to the bully.
- * Say 'I do not like what you are doing. Stop it immediately'.

REPORT

* If nothing is working and the harassment is making you frustrated and uncomfortable, tell an adult immediately.

It would be really helpful to have a conversation with your child/ren about these strategies and to reinforce the actions to take. We look forward to working in partnership to ensure positive steps forward with this issue.



Reconciliation Week at MVPS

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is celebrated across Australia each year between 27 May and 3 June. The dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey—the anniversaries of the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision.

The week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how each of us can join the national reconciliation effort.

The staff and students at McLaren Vale Primary School acknowledge the traditional owners of these Kaurna lands and recognise their continuing connection to land, water and community. We pay our respect to the Kaurna people and their culture, and to elders both past and present.

To commemorate and celebrate this important event, our school and the Madge Sexton Kindergarten came together for a whole school assembly. R-7 classes contributed a range of fantastic items that reflected a deep understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island cultures. We were also fortunate enough to have local Aboriginal singer and songwriter Cat Warren share her journey and sang 'My Island Home' by Christine Anu. Her performance was breathtaking.

On Tuesday the 30th, ATSI students, along with some JP classes attended the Reconciliation event at Ramsay Place. The event was a great success with over a thousand attendees and a range of activities and performances for everyone to enjoy. We would like to thank everyone for their involvement and contribution to another successful Reconciliation Week at MVPS. We look forward to celebrating NAIDOC Week with you all from the 2nd of July!
