#### What's happening in class?

#### ROOM 17 - CELEBRATION CAVE

This is a project Mrs Turner has done with past classes a number of times; it has always been a highlight for everyone involved. This term we researched different celebrations around the world, with the aim of being able to teach small groups of Junior Primary students what the celebration is, who celebrates it, why & how it came to be – while engaging the younger students in a craft activity related to the celebration. Students worked with peers to research: Yabun Festival, Diwali, Holi: Festival of Colour, Jewish Passover, Halloween, Dia De Los Muertos (Day of the Dead), Ramadan & Eid-ul-Fitr, Carnevale, St Patrick's Day, Boys' Day & Girls' Day Festivals, Vietnamese Children's Moon Festival, Tibetan Prayer Festival, American Independence Day & the Ho Lim Festival. They presented a summary to our class via Seesaw then spent time preparing & rehearsing for the Celebration Cave event: all 9 JP classes visiting to experience the 12 stations. Why is it a Celebration Cave? Because Mrs T has always wanted to do a Santa's Cave, but wanted it to be more multi-cultural! J Since we have had a lot of absences with various people, we had to adjust the station topics & some groups so that all present could participate. This week (Wk8) we ran our stations for all of the Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 classes on Monday & Wednesday. It was another fantastic event!







It is a big success so far. Our group worked perfectly & there were no interruptions. (Ethan) It went really well in the first lesson but it didn't go as well in the second & third because we had trouble with the string for the masks. (Liam)
