Beck Frears our new performing arts teacher covering music, dance and drama and facilitating the choir, Victoria Brown as special education teacher (Mon/Wed) and teaming with Simon Lovett in the 6 & 7 class on Fridays, Cate Schueller in the literacy coach coordinator role and teaming with Kim Corbett (Mon/Tues), Nicky Clark in the Wellbeing Leader Coordinator position (Mon/Wed), Amanda Marcel continuing but in a permanent SSO3 Finance Manager role, Wendy Lithgow in a lead coach role in numeracy (Thur) and teaming with Lauren in Year 6 (Fri) and to Simon Lovett who will have a lead teacher role in wellbeing on Fridays.

Our staff have been busy working together prior to the start of the term to prepare relevant and engaging learning experiences that support and challenge our students. During these initial weeks, the emphasis is on building cohesive class communities based around respectful relationships and supporting every child to grow and develop social and personal skills to be self-aware and self-managing. A driver for this is the continuation of Play Is The Way, with a focus initially on the golden rule: treat others as you would want to be treated along with showing kindness to others. We are again offering mindfulness lessons in a six lesson block for all of our classes, beginning in week 3 with our senior classes.

We continue to look for ways to address and promote growth in any areas requiring improvement. Our key directions for 2020 are continuing our literacy work in reading along with a stronger focus in writing and number. We have two student free days scheduled for week 10 on Tuesday 31st March and Wednesday 1st April when our staff will work intensely with a literacy consultant, Sheena Cameron in these areas. There is always much to consider and this year we will further develop knowledge, understanding and skills relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures and sustainability.

We are very optimistic about travelling a well-intentioned journey together with our staff team. Each year as new people join our team and as we each reflect on the previous year's work to refine our practices, new ideas are generated and shared and we are continually in this cycle of growth.

2020 is going to be a great year for all of us at McLaren Vale.

We look forward to the new opportunities that lie ahead and working in partnership with our families.

Play is the Way

MATT MILLAR

Last year our staff were trained in Play Is The Way, a practical method for teaching social and emotional skills using guided play, classroom activities and self-reflective language. Staff participated in a variety of cooperative games that challenged their communication, cooperation and resilience, skills that we are aiming to strengthen in kids. Throughout the day the presenter, Wilson McAskill drew upon the basic principles of the program and how to embed these across the school. This year we are focussing deeper on the program, the games, language and principles of the program. They include:

TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD LIKE THEM TO TREAT YOU – If someone is unlike you seek to understand them

HAVE REASONS FOR THE THINGS YOU SAY AND DO – If you don't know why you're doing something then don't do it because it's most likely wrong

BE BRAVE, PARTICIPATE TO PROGRESS – School is about stepping bravely into the unknown. The unknown is often uncomfortable. The braver you are, the more you learn.

IT TAKES GREAT STRENGTH TO BE SENSIBLE – We do the right thing because it's the best thing to do.

PURSUE YOUR PERSONAL BEST NO MATTER WHO YOU WORK WITH – We don't come to school to be better than others. We come to school to better ourselves by being able to work with others

Students will also learn self-mastery skills, crucial for developing resilience, problem solving skills and skills that will follow them into adulthood.

THE SELF-MASTERY CHECKLIST:

- Am I doing the right thing or the wrong thing?
- Am I making a strong choice or weak choice?
- Are my feelings in charge of my actions or is my thinking in charge?
- Am I running away from the problem or am I dealing with it?
- Am I being my own boss or am I inviting my teacher to be my boss?
- Is my teacher trying to help me or hurt me?

This language along with the games and principles will be embedded gradually across the school. We believe once it is implemented our students will be happier, more resilient and masters of their thinking and feelings.

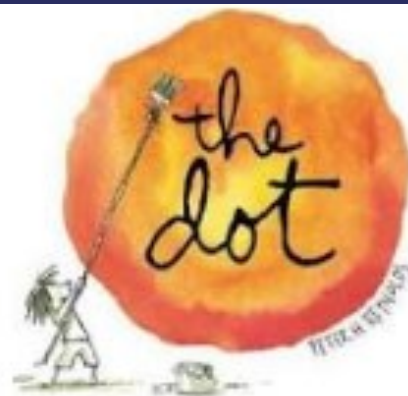
