COVID Restrictions-Term 3

LEANNE LOVETT - DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

As you may know, restrictions will ease in schools next term. This is what it will look like at MVPS in Term 3:

PARENTS, VOLUNTEERS, DEPARTMENTAL SUPPORT AND OTHER SERVICE PROVIDERS MAY AGAIN ENTER SCHOOL GROUNDS.

- Students still need to be dropped off **OUTSIDE** classrooms.
- We do not want to lose the maximisation of learning time that we now have students are in seats working before the bell goes at 8.50, we do not want to lose this!
- No parents/caregivers inside classrooms unless it is organised volunteering (your child's teacher will communicate this to you as appropriate).
- Teachers will find meaningful ways to ensure families feel connected to their teacher and the learning in the classroom daily seesaw posts, regular conversations, etc.
- Volunteering in classrooms and within school needs to ensure physical distancing, and a *Gov. SA Covid-19 site entry form* needs to be completed at the office EVERY time, before volunteers enter classrooms and learning spaces.
- Parents/caregivers still have to physical distance at pick up and drop off thankyou to those families doing this well.
- R-2 students will have their bags packed up before parents/caregivers come into the grounds to support a quick move out of the school grounds.
- Volunteering as normal returns for SAKG in garden AND kitchen lessons (volunteers must complete a *Gov. SA Covid-19 site entry form* at office before they participate).

ALL EXTERNAL SERVICE PROVIDERS AND VOLUNTEERS MUST COMPL**ete the** *60V. Sa covid-19 site entry form* **o**n entry.

NDIS external providers will be communicated with to let them know if they can come back in Term 3 or not. The amount of
providers allowed in will unfortunately be limited by external spaces that are available due to physical distancing and in school
intervention programs.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES CAN RECOMMENCE WITH RESTRICTIONS

- Assemblies will recommence in Term 3 with a modified schedule (this will be communicated with you).
- 2 year level group assemblies per term.
- Only adults of class hosting assembly invited.
- Only one adult per family.
- Seating laid out to ensure adult physical distancing.
- All adults attending will need to complete a Gov. SA Covid-19 site entry form before entry to assembly.
- Maximum amount of adults will be communicated to class teacher.

ALL INTRASTATE CAMPS AND EXCURSIONS ARE NOW ALLOWED TO GO AHEAD

- Camps and excursions recommence as of Term 3 (classroom teachers will communicate this to families as applicable).
- Remember financial assistance and arrangements for camps and excursions is available.
- Staff are reviewing the planned events in T3 and T4 and confirming calendars and will communicate this to families.

ALL SCHOOL SPORT COMPETITIONS, SPORTS DAYS AND CARNIVALS, INCLUDING INTER-SCHO<mark>OL COMP</mark>ETITIONS (USE OF CHANGE ROOMS AND SHOWER FACILITIES IS NOT PERMITTED) CAN 60 AHEAD.

- Sports Day go ahead with families as per usual (more information will be distributed to families shortly).
- Any other relevant competitions etc. will be communicated to families as needed.


- No school discos for 2020.

Screen Time

MATT MILLAR - SENIOR LEADER

Screen time is the amount of time spent watching a screen or electronic media for entertainment. It includes:

- · Watching TV, DVDs and other online shows
- Using computers or other devices to access online entertainment
- Playing games on consoles, computers and mobile phones
- Texting and social media use

The human brain is constantly building connections and growing, and digital media is quickly playing an active role in that process. Children need a diverse menu of online and offline experiences, including the chance to be creative.

Social media and video games work on what is called a variable reward system, similar to pokies. A young brain lacks a fully developed self-control system to stop obsessive behaviour that can occur when engaging in social media and video game experiences.

Australia's Physical Activity and Sedentary Behaviour Guidelines suggest the following screen time limits:

Ages 0-2: No screen time

Ages 2-5: Less than 1 hour per day Ages 5-17: Less than 2 hours per day

WHAT DOESN'T CONSTITUTE AS SCREEN TIME?

Screen time does not include time spent on educational activities, such as for school work and enhancing learning experiences. *Harvard Medical School* research states "It's not how long we're using screens that matters, it's how we're using them that's critical."

SCREEN TIME AT MCLAREN VALE PRIMARY SCHOOL.

With greater use of devices such as Chromebooks and iPads at McLaren Vale Primary School we are well aware that the level of screen time is increasing in the daily lives of students and the research behind its use. We have started looking at a model for using digital technology for learning and how we can enhance learning experiences through the use of digital resources.

This involves moving away from children as consumers of technology, and towards being creators (making presentations, movies, websites, etc.).

We are currently exploring the G Suite (Google's digital resources for publishing) with Google Classroom as the platform for learning.

Current use and trialling in our classrooms has shown that extended periods of use are no greater than 60-90 minutes per day and the resources being used are increasing student engagement and developing creativity, critical thinking and collaboration. These are all much needed skills for life and work in the 21st Century.

Our staff are committed to providing rich learning experiences with technology and ensuring its use in the classroom is not only effective, but safe for all students.




NATALIE WELLS - OSHC DIRECTOR

Statements for outstanding school fees were sent out at the end of last term. 2020 M&S fees were due to be paid by Friday April 9 (end of term 1).

This was also the due date for the lodgement of school card and applications to pay by instalments.

We understand that the impact of COVID19 has been significant for many of our families and the last few months has brought much uncertainty.

We would like to reassure our families that if they are having difficulty in making payments we are here to work with you and support you during these times. Please contact the Finance Office as soon as possible if you would like to discuss what options are available to you.

The Governing Council believes that it is important for all families to actively contribute to the successful financial management of the school and have a debt recovery policy which includes referring outstanding accounts to a debt recovery service. We encourage you to contact the school as soon as possible to avoid this action.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

This semester has been a busy and exciting one for the students in Room 2. It all started with designing and making a tool to hunt for living things in our school environment. We learnt that our school is home to many beautiful birds so we decided to create our ideal bird homes for them. This was lots of fun because we discovered the sky was the limit with what we could build. We could cut, bend, stick, join, paint, glue, fold, colour, weave etc. and our bird homes not only looked fabulous but actually attracted real birds.
