### COVID 19 Update

### LYN LANGELUDDECKE —PRINCIPAL

As you would probably already be aware, the Chief Public Health Officer and Police Commissioner have announced easing of restrictions in South Australia.

From Monday 23rd all schools, preschools and early childhood settings will be open for all students to attend. We expect all of our students to return to classroom learning.

As the Chief Public Health Officer has emphasised, just because the hard lockdown is being lifted, this doesn't mean that the risks associated with COVID-19 have passed.

As a result, the following restrictions will be in place:

- No adults other than school staff are allowed to come inside the school gates.
- There will be staff members (leadership, non-classroom teaching staff and school service officers) around the school entrance gates to support your child to transition into school. Pick up and collection points will be on Caffrey Street, Main Road and basketball court exits into carpark and backtrack.
- All adults outside of the school gates need to be wearing a mask (if possible) and physical distancing.
- At the end of the school day you will need to make arrangements for your child to meet you at a school gate. Again, you are not permitted to come inside the school gates or to wait outside classrooms. Classroom teachers and other staff will support this process and bring children out to gates as possible.
- OSHC service will run as per usual. Parents will need to contact OSHC directly with any adjustments (8323 9217).
- No volunteers are permitted on the school grounds, unless contacted directly by the classroom teacher who will be working within current guidelines.
- External providers working with students with additional needs are unable to come on site unless organised directly with Leanne Lovett.
- Children do not need to wear masks. Staff are only required to wear masks coming to and leaving school grounds.
- The end of Year Concert is going ahead on Wednesday, so please ensure that you return your child's permission form and ensure your child is at school on Monday and Tuesday as there will be some rehearsal catch ups needed.
- All excursions and events already planned are to go ahead as organised. However changes may result from restrictions by external organisations. All changes will be communicated via Seesaw (keep an eye on this please). Please ensure you return all consent forms and make payments as required. If anything is cancelled all monies will be refunded.
- The School Closure planned for this Friday 27th November will still go ahead. There will be no OSHC services available.
- Canteen will be open as usual.
- Please note: The Chief Public Health Officer has stated that it is safe for children to be at school. As such, the school is not required
  to provide a home learning program should parents opt to keep their children home.

MVPS staff are very excited to be able to welcome students back to school to end their year as planned, but it is vital that our parent/caregiver community supports us with the above restrictions so that we can do this successfully. Thank you very much for your support over the last couple of days. We look forward to having your child back at school on Monday.

As information changes we will communicate this with you, so please keep an eye on your email and Seesaw accounts.

# Job Sharing at MVPS

Another common response from parents when providing feedback on the following year's classes for their children, is that they prefer a class with one teacher. Since this is not always possible I thought it may be helpful for families to have a greater understanding of why we have part-time teaching arrangements.

It's no secret that teaching is a demanding job with a seemingly ever-increasing workload, so it stands to reason that schools need to have flexible working arrangements that enable them to get the best from all educators, regardless of the hours they work.


Teaching is a job that requires you to give of yourself, no matter how many hours you do it for. Some teachers find that they can give the best parts of themselves to teaching through working part time.

The perception that the ideal teacher that works full-time achieves more, is far from the truth. Whilst we know that continuity of learning is of the highest importance in the schooling of children, job sharing, if managed well, can achieve the same outcomes, if not greater. I have experienced many examples of job sharing in the schools that I have worked and generally speaking, the flexibility results in higher levels of staff engagement. Happier teachers are generally more likely to be loyal to the school, meaning that the school retains their expertise and maximises its investment into them. By contrast, high teacher turnover means that a school is constantly investing in training new people which is costly and time consuming.

In situations where teachers opt to work part time, our focus is always on the needs of the child. In fact what we tend to find is that most part time teachers put in the extra to compensate for the shorter week and it's certainly evident that they are brighter and more alert in the changeover. Currently we have situations where the job-share partners bring very different things to the table which enriches the learning opportunities for our children. Less stress outside of teaching seems like a good way to avoid passing it on to the children, and an even better way to protect against burnout and absenteeism.

So if part-timers are likely to be well-organised, happy with their work-life balance, loyal and delivering value for the investment of the school, we need to support them. Ultimately it's about the focus and passion you show when you're there, not about how many hours you work.

At MVPS teachers who share a classroom are expected to put effective processes in place to ensure continuity of learning for all children in their class. They spend many hours out of school time planning together, sharing information and working towards ensuring that children are reaching their full potential.

We looked at the Almond Train and crossed to see the war memorial and leopard tank. We looked at several other old buildings of interest and then had ice blocks at S.G. Ellis Park before returning to school. We shortened the day due to the hot weather, but the children learned a lot and enjoyed the day.


