For example, rooms will have the Kurna number displayed on their doors, students will learn the colours for the sports teams in Kurna, all students will know how to conduct a basic conversation in Kurna.

Welcome to 2021

Welcome Families,

We are now into week 3 with classes well into their term 1 learning program. It's fantastic to see the way in which our students have settled in so quickly to their new classes, including the 78 new receptions.

The transition to new classes for some children can create some anxiety but our focus is always to work with families, often well before the term has started, to support and prepare them for the change and we continue to keep an eye on these children and check in with them regularly.

For our educators, there is always an air of excitement at the start of every new year with the possibilities that lay ahead with their new class. Teachers have worked extensively together to get their years program underway and this collective approach to planning as you will see will lead to greater consistency in approaches across classes as well as exciting opportunities for our students in the full range of educational experiences that underpin their learning.

Building strong relationships with families is the cornerstone of our work and moving forward within the COVID safe approach, we are already talking about ways that we can increase the personal contact so that parents/caregivers feel connected to the class, the teachers and the school leaders.

Although we have had to restrict numbers, our Acquaintance Night, held on Tuesday evening, provided an opportunity for at least one family member to meet the class and specialist teachers and to get a feel of how the year would unfold for the children. Our teachers are well prepared in their documentation and will distribute class information for those not able to attend the evening session. The class term overview sent to all families will provide families with an outline of the learning program in each subject area. Please make sure that you are signed up for Seesaw as this is the main form of communication between teachers and families. You are also able to email and/or phone the school to make an appointment with your child's teacher if you have concerns that require a conversation. The first point of call is always the classroom teacher in resolving issues. School leadership are always available should you need help to unpack concerns.

The learning program in the initial weeks of school has a focus on children's wellbeing and in building cohesive class communities. This is essential in setting the class up for a successful year's learning as we know that positive wellbeing and the development of social competencies is at the heart of each child's success with their learning. Learning focuses on our students being able to self-manage, to be a team player, to be able to express their feelings, to communicate effectively and to manage conflicts peacefully. We aim for every child to feel a sense of belonging to the school, their teachers, and their peers and to have a strong sense of pride at being a student at McLaren Vale Primary School.

Similarly for our staff, we have a team of very conscientious, caring and capable educators who recognise the importance of their work in making every day count for every student. We hope this year that students think of school as a place where communities of learners gather and do interesting work that matters.

We are very optimistic about our journey together this year. Our 2021 school improvement goals will build on our existing work in reading, spelling, writing and number, but refining and delving deeper. Our literacy data is showing that we are performing well and our numeracy; that we have pockets of growth but overall, need to improve. Hence, hot off the mark we are launching into mathematics and have a comprehensive training program for staff planned, working with Tierney Kennedy, a private consultant from Queensland. Our initial focus is to analyse both staff beliefs and student data and to tailor the program according to our staff's needs. Our first staff day is on **Thursday 18 Feb which is a Student Free Day**. We know this is not ideal being mid-week but we were limited with options as Tierney is well and truly booked years in advance. OSHC bookings will be essential for families needing care.

We are very proud of our school's progress and our students' academic achievement. Our Education Director who has a bird's eye view across many schools commends us for our high achievement and the focused work of our staff. If you are keen to hear more about our school's journey, we would encourage you to attend our **Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 16 Feb at 6:00pm** in the library. We will outline prior achievements from 2020 as well as present our visions for 2021. We are also looking for new members so if you are keen to join the Council or a committee, see the information attached and come to next week's meeting.

We look forward to the new opportunities that lie ahead and working with our community to grow our learning and collectively contribute towards a 'world class' school. Please catch up with us when we are out and about and share your stories with us.





Breakfast Club

Run on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, Breakfast Club is a free program open to all students who may not have had the chance to have something to eat in the morning. It is also for those individuals who may have eaten already but are hungry again by the time the school days starts. The program will run for 8:15am to 8:45am and will be held in the school kitchen.


