Reception to year 4 students performed their musical 'Pirates of the Curry Bean'. The year 3/4 classes acted out the main roles and the junior primary classes took on the role of chorus members, all dancing to different songs that fit into the musical storyline. We are so proud of our students for pulling together this performance in such a short time. We squeezed a years worth of work into 7 weeks. I have appreciated the relationships that I have had with many of you and will miss the connections and the friendship.

There are many things that I appreciate about our children; They are confident, happy and full of life and never cease to amaze me with their humour, their big smiles and friendly hellos and so conversant, their genuine interest in asking about my weekend and telling me about theirs, the excitement in sharing their work, their kindness, their politeness and their thoughtful treatment of each other. I love that they come to school every day ready for learning with a desire to be their best...they are all champions and I will miss them terribly....

And lastly, the work of **our leadership team**... working with Leanne and Matt has been an unforgettable experience and I am so grateful for their unconditional support and partnership – their tenacity, hard work and talent has contributed towards our success. Many times we have been tested by the sheer volume and complexity of our work but the strength of our partnership has got us through. In amongst all of this, I am going to continue to do some contractual work with the Department in mentoring new principals, enabling me to utilise the knowledge that I have amassed with 30 years' experience as a Principal.

Again, I want to thank you for your collegiality, friendship and support and all the wonderful memories that I have of our school over the past 5 years! Our paths are bound to cross as a close neighbour and I'm sure I'll be back for a visit and will continue to follow the journey of the school.
